COURSE PROGRAM IN DETAILS

I. Higher Secondary Course (Arts)

Sipajhar College offers the Higher Secondary (H.S) course only in the Arts stream. It is a Two Year Programme meant for students who have passed the Class X examination from any standard Board or Council as accepted by the Ministry of Education of the Govt. of India. The college accepts students belonging to all standard boards and councils. The combination of subjects and the compulsory subjects offered at the Higher Secondary level are as follows:

Compulsory Subjects: **English and Assamese (MIL)/Alt. English & Environmental Studies**

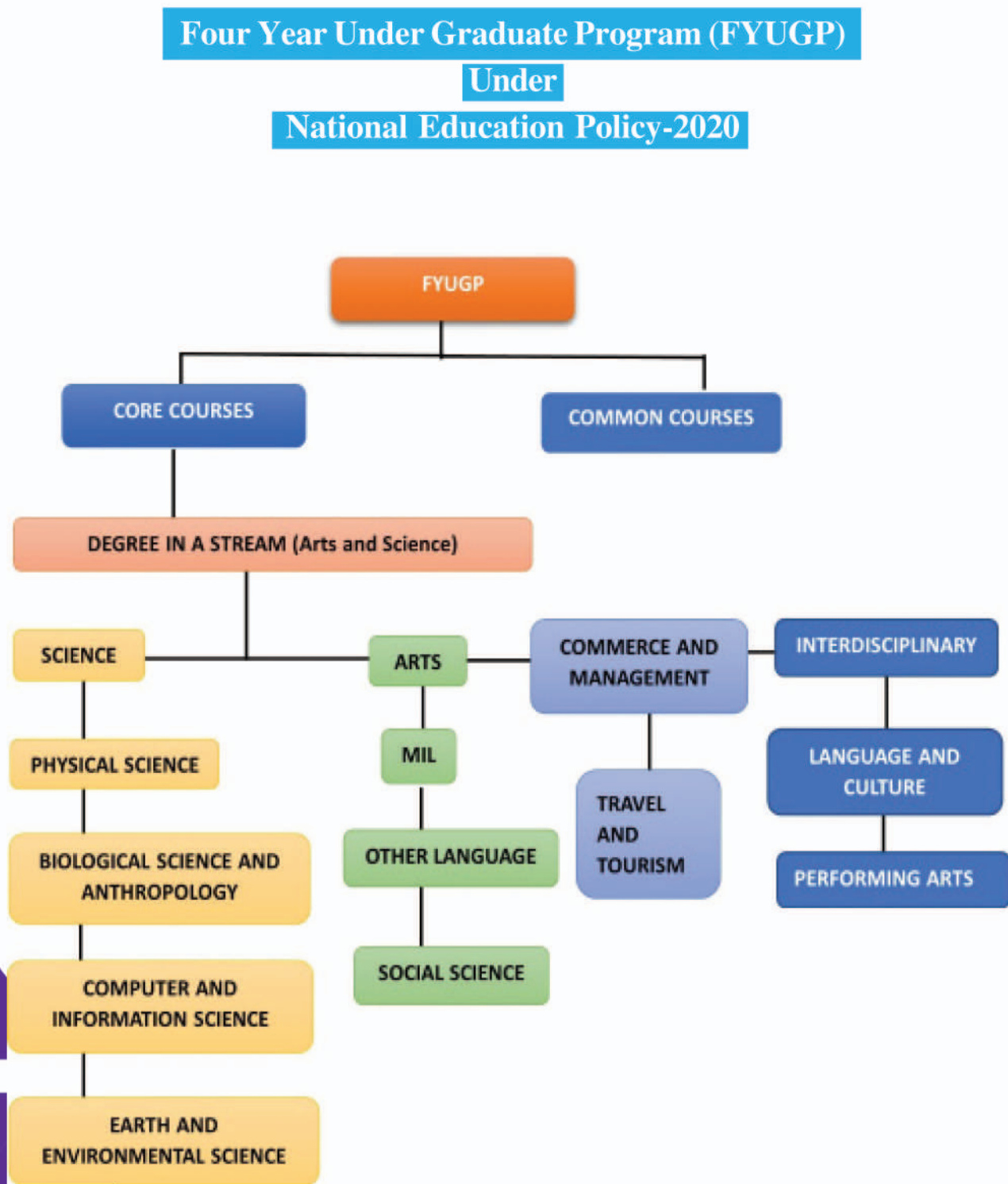
Students have the option of selecting any three subjects from the list of subjects given below. She/he can also take up a fourth subject as optional.

New Subjects will be introduced as and when notified by the Assam Higher Secondary Educational Council (AHSEC).

II. Four Years Degree Course Program (for both Arts and Science)

As part of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the Gauhati University will adopt the **Four Year Under Graduate Program (FYUGP) at the UG level** from the session 2023-24. As Sipajhar College is an affiliated college under Gauhati University, so Sipajhar College will follow the FYUGP from 2023 onwards at the UG level. The flowchart of FYUGP is shown below”:

I. PROCEDURE FOR APPLICATION AND ADMISSION

- Admission to FYUGP for B.A./ B.Sc. 1st Semester and H.S. 1st year Arts, will be done entirely through **SAMARTH & DARPAN portal respectively in ONLINE mode** for the session 2025-26.
- The students are to apply online at the Online Admission link shared in the College Website.
- The following are the mandatory requirements for admission:
 - Bank Account of the Applicant
 - Valid Email ID of the applicant
 - Mobile No. of the Applicant linked to the Bank A/C
- All Government grants will be directly credited to the account of the applicant.
- While submitting the forms online, the students must upload the documents as mentioned in the online application form.
- Students can avail the free admission for the session 2025-26 if they can produce the document as per govt. OM.
- After the completion of the application process, the **Merit List** and the **Cut Offs** for each subject will be released in the **ONLINE ADMISSION PORTAL** in college website.
***N.B: No other document will be accepted for the Income certificate.**
- Selection of the candidates for admission will be done by the Selection Committee. The committee also reserves the right to modify the subjects chosen by the candidates depending on the availability of seats.
- The allotment of **Major Subjects** will be decided by Heads of respective Departments solely on the basis of Merit and seats will be filled on first-come-first-served basis.
- Admission is given purely on the basis of merit but a few seats are reserved for the Physically challenged students and for those belonging to SC/ST as per Govt. rules.
- A select number of seats are allocated specifically for students who exhibit extraordinary proficiency in sports, culture, and community service endeavors.

II. Documents to be uploaded along with APPLICATION FORM

1. Mark Sheet of last qualifying examination.
2. Admit card and original Pass Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
3. Certificate related to extracurricular activities.

6. Relevant certificates for the physically handicapped students issued by competent authorities like the Social Welfare Department, Govt. of Assam.

III. Other Amenities

✓ Student Support Services:

- The college provides free meditation and yoga classes for students by incorporating the same into the college routine. It is mandatory from 2nd semester onwards. Other interested students can also attend. These classes are conducted by trained meditation experts from the local center of the **Prajapita Brahma Kumari**.
- The College has an indoor sport training center with a fully equipped gymnasium.
- The college has a canteen within the campus which provides good quality food at very reasonable rates.

✓ Health Care Centre:

The College has a fully equipped Health Care Centre with a Doctor from the Sipajhar Community Health Centre on Call during College working hours. A blood donation camp is organized every year to aware students about importance of Blood Donation.

✓ Modern Facilities available:

The latest in educational facilities and opportunities are provided here like access to the Internet. Teaching aids such as ICT, LCD projectors, Computers and Microphones have been made available to all the departments. The following are the available facilities in our college:

- ❖ Yoga & Meditation Centre
- ❖ Digital Classrooms

✓ **Information cum Career Guidance and Counselling Cell (ICGC)**

This is a student welfare service aimed at providing the students with guidance and counseling to cope with personal and social problems and to provide wide exposure to career opportunities. Through workshops, seminars, individual counseling sessions, and access to relevant literature and online resources, the cell empowers students to make well-informed decisions about their educational and career pursuits.

✓ **NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)**

Established in 1993 to inculcate social consciousness and a sense of responsibility, discipline and dignity of labor among the youth the National Service Scheme (NSS) is a voluntary organization of college students under the Union Ministry of Human Resource Development. Students can enroll themselves in the NSS unit of the college at the beginning of the academic session. The college unit of the NSS takes up a number of social service programs with active participation of the people of the locality, social service programs with active participation of the people of the locality.

✓ **Bharat Scouts and Guides**

The Unit of Bharat Scouts and Guides was constituted at Sipajhar College in 2009. Since then, it has been rendering a fruitful service to the college participating in all its auspicious occasions. Besides, the unit also involves itself in different occasions and activities arranged by the State as well as the Central Government.

✓ **Student Aid Fund**

The College has an aid fund for economically weaker students. However, since the number of such students is very high, financial assistance to be provided to all such students is not possible. Hence the college has set up a Book Bank which provides books to the needy students (In addition to the ones they are entitled to borrow from the Central Library)

✓ **AWARDS AND PRIZES:**

- ◆ The college has a **“Best Graduate Award”** for the student who is the topper in the University exams from the College. All students securing a CGPA of 10 in the University final exams will also be suitably awarded by the College.
- ◆ The Sipajhar College Teachers’ Co-operative Society awards the Best Graduate of the College.
- ◆ **“Dr. Sarada Nair Memorial Award”** is given to students getting highest marks in English (Major) among the students of Sipajhar College in the final examination of GU.
- ◆ The college has **“Udipta Bharadwaj Memorial Trust”** instituted in 2018 which provides cash awards and citations to two selected students of the college.
- ◆ **“Late Arati Nath Memorial Award”** is given to the best graduate of Department of Education of Sipajhar College.
- ◆ **“Late Paribanu Begum Memorial Award”** is given to the best graduate of Department of Education of Sipajhar College.
- ◆ The college offers three prizes to the three best departments participating in the cultural procession taken out as part of the College Week.

✓ College Library

- The College Library is the hub of the academic activities supporting the institution's mission of achieving excellence in education and research.
- Sipajhar College has a modern computerized library with an impressive collection of around Nineteen thousand books, several local and national newspapers and more than two dozen journals, both national and international.
- It also has a good collection of magazines, e-resources, e-journals, e-books, bibliographic databases, etc.
- All students, faculties and employees of the College are entitled to make use of the Library facilities. The library also renders service to people from outside the college community after receiving due permission from the college authority
- The library has open and remote access system, LAN facility, internet section and spacious reading area provides an atmosphere favorable to the excitement of mental discovery. Students are always encouraged to do the optimum utilization of the library resources by creating a user-friendly atmosphere.
- The library also provides access to e-resources to the teachers and students of the College through UGC-INFLIBNET N-List programme. The library remains open from 10 A.M. to 4 P.M. on all working days.
- A student will have to apply on a separate form supplied by the librarian to access the library facilities.
- Recently, electronic attendance system has installed in the Library and students can use their I-Cards (Machine Readable) for the attendance in the library.
- **All the departments of the college have well-stocked departmental libraries for the use of students having major in the concerned subject.**

✓ RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LIBRARY

- ◆ All members have to record their name, address and time of arrival and departure and put their signature in the Register kept at the library entrance.
- ◆ All bags and carrying cases must be left in the shelves located at the entrance of the library.
- ◆ Disruptive behavior, such as creating loud noise, loud talking, screaming, or banging on computer keyboards are strictly prohibited.
- ◆ Consuming food or beverages inside the library is strictly prohibited.
- ◆ Each student is allowed to borrow two books at a time.
- ◆ Books are issued to students for a period of One months. They may be reissued for another 15 days.
- ◆ An overdue charge of Rs. 1.00 only per day is levied if a book is kept beyond the due date.
- ◆ Students can avail the computer facility for utilizing the e-resources only.
- ◆ Books on loan with members can be recalled at any time, without assigning any reason thereof.

✓ **WOMEN'S HOSTEL**

A full-fledged Women's Hostel having all modern amenities has been functioning for the last decade and offer accommodation for girls. It has a seat capacity of 60 and the students are allotted seats on the basis of merit. However, women coming from remote places with inadequate transport and communication facilities are given priority. A separate form for admission to the hostel can be obtained from the hostel warden on the day of college admission. It is to be filled and submitted to the warden at the time of admission.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR BOARDERS OF THE WOMEN'S HOSTEL

1. Boarders must pay their monthly mess dues on time.
2. No Boarder is allowed to leave the hostel without prior permission from the hostel Superintendent.
3. Visitors are allowed to meet a boarder only during visiting hours and in the visiting room.
4. All hostel property like furniture, utensils, electrical appliances etc should be treated properly and in the event of any damage the matter should be brought to the notice of the superintendent immediately.
5. Use of unauthorised electrical appliances such as heaters and irons are strictly prohibited.
6. Expulsion from the college hostel implies expulsion from the college and vice versa.
7. The hostel remains closed during all vacations.
8. A student may stay as a hostel guest during examinations, with prior permission from the hostel superintendent. Such a guest can stay for not more than a month and she will have to pay Rs 200 as seat rent to the college.
9. Any student staying in the hostel for more than a month will be treated as a regular boarder.

✓ **STUDENTS' UNION**

The students' union of the college is a constitutionally elected body that enjoys a term of one year. It is entrusted with all the activities related to the interests and welfare of the students of the college. The students' union has its own room and plays a proactive role in the affairs of the college. It is entrusted with the responsibilities of organizing the annual All Assam Debate Competition, the College Week and Fresher's Social etc. The college authority provides assistance and co-operation to the Students' Union in all its activities.

✓ **UNIFORM**

The prescribed uniform of the college is as follows:

➤ **GIRLS**

- a. Coffee coloured salwar and dupatta with beige coloured kurta with college logo.
- b. Coffee coloured sweater with college logo.

➤ **BOYS**

- a. Coffee coloured pants and beige coloured shirt with college logo.
- b. Coffee coloured sweater with college logo.

College Logo will be provided by the College Authority on payment of the prescribed fee.

✓ STUDENTS' IDENTITY CARD

The college identity card is issued to the students at the time of admission. The duly filled in identity card authenticated by the signature of the Principal of the college is to be carried by all students. In case of any loss or damage to the card, the matter should be immediately reported to the Principal and a duplicate will be issued on payment of the prescribed fee.

✓ CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Games and Sports: The College has an Indoor Sports Training Centre with state-of-the-art equipment built with UGC assistance under the XI Plan. It provides facilities for indoor sports and games like Badminton, Table Tennis. The indoor sports room is well furnished and have synthetic court for Badminton sport. The college also has a walled sports field with a gallery for outdoor games like Football and Cricket.

Yoga: To aware about Yoga among our students, a class of Yoga and meditation is included in the regular class routine. For such, our college have a Yoga and Meditation room for the students. These classes are conducted by trained yoga experts.

College Magazine: A college magazine is published in the open Meeting of the College week every year to provide avenues for the expression of the literary talents of its students and is a useful record of all important college activities. Wall magazines are also brought out by all the departments of the college annually and by the Students' Union twice a year.

✓ STUDENTS' TRAVELLING CONCESSION

Students of the college are entitled to concessions on travel home and back during vacation, for travelling on academic tours organised by the college and for travel in connection with college activities.
